Call for Nomination For the Position of Canada's Parliamentary Poet Laureate

Eligibility

- In order to give equal representation to Canada's two official languages, Poets Laureate are selected alternately from each official language's literary communities. A poet who writes predominantly in French will be selected for the 2023-2024 term.
- Candidates must be residents of Canada.

Criteria for selection

Candidates must:

Submission

- have made significant contributions to the literary community
- have a substantial record demonstrating literary excellence
- be available to travel throughout Canada to promote the value of poetry
- be available to participate in parliamentary events, as required

Process for nomination

Nominations for the position can be submitted by a member of a literary or writing organization, a Parliamentarian or directly by interested candidates.

The nominator must inform the nominee of the submission.

Incomplete submissions and unsolicited attachments will not be considered.

this completed supporting documentation form;

a completed nomination form;

a letter of nomination;

a brief description (up to 250 words) of the nominee's **significant** contributions to the literary community and why they should be considered an outstanding nominee (this may be part of the nominator's letter);

a brief description (up to 250 words) of how the nominee has influenced other literary artists (this may be part of the nominator's letter);

a one-page biography of the nominee, summarizing education, significant achievements, current professional activities, any honours or awards received and a copy of the nominee's current bibliography; **OR** a copy of the nominee's current curriculum vitae, including the above-noted information;

two letters from colleagues in the literary field supporting the nomination;

five copies of one of the nominee's published books or other publications and/or five audio or video copies of a work in the oral tradition. Nominators are encouraged to flag particular poems or passages that they would like to highlight

a letter from the nominee confirming that they are willing to stand for nomination; take on the role of ambassador for literature; travel throughout Canada promoting literature; participate in Parliamentary events; and outlining what they would like to bring to the position in terms of public outreach or specific activities.
