1. I am appointed by the Governor General on the advice of the Prime Minister. I facilitate debates and business in the Upper Chamber.	Speaker of the Senate
2. I ask parliamentarians tough questions and report on the work of Parliament to Canadians. My job is to hold Parliament and parliamentarians accountable.	Journalist
3. I represent the Monarch in Canada. I give Royal Assent to bills after they are passed by the Senate and House of Commons. I call elections and open Parliament.	Governor General
4. I am appointed by the Governor General on the advice of the Prime Minister to represent a region of the country. Besides proposing and passing bills, I meet regularly with Canadians to hear their views on bills and national issues.	Senator
5. I am (usually) the leader of the party with the most seats in the House of Commons. My party helps set the agenda for the issues and bills discussed at Parliament.	Prime Minister
6. I am elected by Canadians to represent a constituency (or riding). I propose, debate and vote on bills.	Member of the House of Commons
7. I am elected by my colleagues in the Lower Chamber to make sure that rules and procedure are followed. During debates, all questions are directed to me.	Speaker of the House of Commons
8. I am Canada's head of state. I am also the head of state of 15 other countries.	Monarch
